## **VOCAB WORDS**

## 1. ELITE

A select group of people that are viewed as more special or powerful than the average person.

### 2.PEASANT

In the old days, this was word was used to describe someone who was poor and had no connections to royalty.

#### 3. FICTITIOUS

This word describes something that is not true. It can also mean that something is imaginary...like fiction!

## PLOT

In the adaptation of Black and Brown Theatre's Rapunzel that you will soon watch, the story follows a lonely prince who is tired of living in the castle and a sad girl longing to break free from her tower.

Like the original story, Rapunzel's father gives her up to an old woman in hopes that she'll have a better life. But in this new version, the prince pretends to be a peasant in order to make sure that Rapunzel really likes him for who he is.

What do you think will happen when Rapunzel finds out the man she met is actually a prince?!

AN ADAPTATION TAKES AN EXISTING STORY AND CHANGES THE DETAILS TO FIT THE NEW WORLD THE AUTHOR WANTS TO CREATE. MOST DISNEY MOVIES ARE ACTUALLY ADAPTATIONS OF CLASSIC FAIRYTALES FROM THE BROTHER'S GRIMM. BUT NOW RESEARCHERS ARE DISCOVERING THAT THESE GRIMM STORIES THEMSELVES MIGHT BE ADAPTATIONS OF INDIGENOUS FOLKTALES. FOR EXAMPLE, THE PUERTO RICAN TALE OF THE COQUI COMBINES ELEMENTS THAT MAY SOUND FAMILIAR TO BOTH THE LITTLE MERMAID AND THE PRINCESS AND THE FROG.

## **RHYME**

The play uses rhyming words to tell the story of Rapunzel. Every two lines of the story rhyme. This is called a couplet because the rhymes come in a couple (or two at a time).

Here's an example from the play:

### **PRINCE JACOB**

What kind of books do you like? I've got rows!

#### **RAPUNZEL**

I like to read about worlds no one knows...

Now, can you write your own couplet? Create two lines that rhyme, just like a song!

## **VERSE**

In addition to rhyming words, the play is also told in verse. This is a style of writing in which each line has a specific number of syllables. In this case, each line has exactly 10 syllables, but in other countries, verse can be 12 syllables per line.

Here's an example from the story. Count the syllables to double-check.

#### **RAPUNZEL**

Dist-ant lands with a prin-cess in dis-guise.

Can you try to write a sentence that has exactly 10 syllables?

- 4. IN THE STORY, RAPUNZEL DOESN'T HAVE AN ANIMAL FRIEND. IF SHE DID, WHAT ANIMAL FRIEND DO YOU THINK SHE WOULD HAVE AND WHY?
